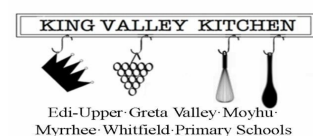

Rural City of Wangaratta Candidates Forum

On Monday evening 3rd October the Moyhu Action Group facilitated a "Candidates Forum" for the South and Warby Wards for the upcoming Rural City of Wangaratta council elections.

This was attended by all candidates nominated in both wards and by approximately 60 residents.

Each candidate introduced themselves and spoke for 2 minutes. This was then followed by a Q&A session where candidates were required to respond to all questions.

Issues covered included:

- Job Creation
- Tourism and Cycling infrastructure
- Rural Land Strategy
- Involvement of young people in council decision making.
- Condition of Roads and Bridges in South and Warby Ward
- Functioning of the Council for the coming 4 years.

A further Q&A session with questions directed to specific candidates then took place. Many of the same matters were raised.

All candidates participated in the forum in a frank and open manner and were respectful of each other.

The Moyhu Action Group thanks them and all present for their participation and contribution into a worthwhile evening.

SOLAR LIGHTS & NEW TREES AT LIONS PARK

A grant of \$7,732.00 from the Victorian Government's Community Safety Fund will allow two solar lights to be installed in the park which will greatly improve the lighting and have no ongoing operational costs. An advanced "Fairview Flame" Red Maple tree, supplied by the Rural City Council, has been planted in the park and another two trees including a Claret Ash, to be planted at the CWA Centenary Plaque, also to be supplied by Council will be planted in the near future.

Norma Bull: The Gift is an exhibition celebrating a recent gift to the Rural City of Wangaratta Collection by Ass. Prof Leslie E Bolitho AM, of a small painting by the late Norma Bull.

Wangaratta Art Gallery is delighted to present an extensive holding of works by this little-known artist to the Wangaratta audience. The exhibition features a significant collection of paintings, prints and drawings from Bright Art Gallery, Ron and Ross Aldridge and MAMA Collections by an artist worthy of celebration, Norma Bull.

Bull's experience as an artist was extensive, her practice took her to Britain during the Second World War where she became an official war artist. A selection of these rare images of war time Britain are featured in the exhibition, including a beautiful portrait of the wife of an airman known as 'Madonna of the Blitz'.

The artist held close affection to North East Victoria and often travelled to Bright for holidays in her later years. Landscapes and images from happier times are also featured often created during holidays in the North East area or at Anglesea on the Victorian coast.

The exhibition opens to the public on Saturday 8th October and runs until Sunday 23 October.

KING VALLEY WALNUTS

A FINALIST FOR REGIONAL AWARD

Myrree based King Valley Walnuts, owned by Carol Kunert and Mike Burston is a finalist in the Victorian Regional Achievement and Community Awards after having made it into the semi-finals last year. Their company has now been operating for 20 years with retail sales having increased by 100 per cent in the past four years and production reaching 32 tonnes this year. Carol said the nomination was a "real confidence booster" and "if we were to win it would be reassuring for us that we are doing the right thing and headed in the right direction." They decided early on that they were going to strive for the finest quality Victorian walnuts and have kept tweaking the way they do things and try to improve them to get that product, "it's nice that our hard work is being acknowledged" Carol said. The business has had to keep up with consumer demand as walnuts gain popularity and their health benefits are becoming better known. The winners will be announced at an awards night in Melbourne's Docklands on Oct. 14th.
